There will be a Zone meeting and 8-I Cabinet meeting on Saturday, Nov. 1, 10 a.m-2 p.m. at Kees Park. This is a great opportunity to meet with other Lions in the area and get ideas for our club. Any Lion is welcome. Don't limit this to officers!

The Pineville Lions Club is sponsoring an alumni basketball game at Louisiana College on Sat, Nov 1 at 5:30 at LC's fieldhouse. Proceeds will support our Lions charitable projects.

Lion Hank Smart introduced our speaker, Dr. John Barnett of the LSU AG Center. The many Ag Centers are part of the LSU system. There is a Chancellor for the Ag Centers, just as there are chancellors for each of the entities in the system, such as LSU-BR, LSUA, LSUE, LSU Medical, etc. Dr. Barnett reports to Dr. Bill Richardson, Chancellor of the Ag Centers and not to Dr. Martin, Chancellor of LSUA. LSUA is considered a sister campus.

The Dean Lee Research Center is actually older than LSUA. It is a research farm. The Ag Center also runs the state 4-H camp in Pollock (Camp Grant Walker) and is about to open a 4-H museum in Mansura.

For several years, Central Louisiana has enjoyed the DeWitt facility which is a livestock complex and multipurpose facility. The state built a massive evacuation center next door which now belongs to LSU and is under the management of the Ag Center. Although scheduled for occupancy in November, it was completed on August 15.

Gov Jindal decided that the scope of the evacuations for Hurricane Gustav at the end of August made it imperative to open the shelter in spite of having no furniture or staff. The state Dept of Social Services was supposed to staff it. But because of the short notice and other problems, the Ag Center was given the task. Dr. Barnett said he was fortunate to have several out-of-state experts arrive with volunteers in tow to direct operations. The American Red Cross volunteers acted as Operations Managers and the US Dept of Health provided full medical services and set up the hospital area of the massive shelter.

Dr. Barnett was very pleased with how well the shelter functioned and was grateful for the wonderful volunteer help he received. He encouraged everyone to drop by and see the shelter.
